## Richmond VAMC Set to Host 32<sup>nd</sup> Wheelchair Games

Richmond VAMC community, I can hardly hold my excitement. The National Veterans Wheelchair Games return to Richmond June 25-30, 2012.

The Games, a joint venture between VA and Paralyzed Veterans of America, began 31 years ago right here on the campus of the Richmond VA Medical Center with 74 Veterans from 14 states. While that was a commendable start for an inaugural event, the Games have made great strides in the intervening years. This year we expect to host nearly 600 wheelchair athletes from across the nation, Puerto Rico and Great Britain, making the 32<sup>nd</sup> National Veterans Wheelchair Games the largest wheelchair sporting event in the world.

The Wheelchair Games will showcase 17 medal events and put the courage and tenacity of Veterans with disabilities on display for all to see and applaud. All events are open to the public; admission is free.

The Games will showcase our city as well, from the venues where the athletes will compete, to the attractions in and around Richmond where the visiting athletes, coaches, event organizers and their families and friends spend their leisure time.

This is no small undertaking. The weeklong event will require close

to 1,000 hotel rooms, partnership between the Richmond VAMC extended family and our neighboring communities, and more than 3,000 volunteers to ensure success.

Fortunately, Team Richmond VAMC has proven time and again that we view challenges as opportunities to excel and I am confident that we will make this summer's Wheelchair Games the best ever. We are very proud to host the Games and excited to share Richmond's hospitality with athletes, coaches, volunteers and staff.

- Approximately one in four athletes at the Games is new to organized wheelchair sports.
