
- ★ Comprehensive services to meet the specific needs of each Servicemember

Directions to STAR Program:

- ★ From I-95 North or South, take exit 69 (Bells Road) and merge to your right
- ★ At the traffic signal turn left onto Bells Road and continue, crossing over Jeff Davis Hwy
- ★ At the second traffic signal turn right onto Belt Blvd
- ★ Proceed to second traffic signal and turn right onto Broad Rock Blvd
- ★ Turning right at the next traffic signal will lead you to the main entrance of the medical center
- ★ Take first right and follow signs to the Polytrauma Transitional Center

The STAR Program in Richmond, Virginia offers an integrated team approach toward comprehensive vocational and physical rehabilitation for injured Servicemembers that will facilitate successful return to military, government or civilian employment.

The STAR Program includes:

- ★ State-of-the-art Medical Rehabilitation in a residential setting
- ★ Highly qualified and experienced rehabilitation professionals who provide:
 - Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation
 - Rehabilitation Nurse Case Management
 - Vocational Rehabilitation Counseling
 - Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, and Kinesiotherapy Services
 - Social Work Services
 - Recreational Therapy Services
 - Prosthetic and Orthotic Services
 - Drivers Training

Role of the STAR Program

- ★ Assist Servicemembers transition from rehabilitation to military, government, or civilian employment
- ★ Provide individualized, community, family, and vocational transition services



- ★ Provide return to independent living services through restoring community and vocational skills
- ★ Provide proactive case management for existing and emerging conditions

STAR Program Admission Criteria

Referrals to the program must meet the following admission criteria:

- ★ Be an Active Duty Servicemember or Veteran
- ★ Have a extremity injury, or other injury with residual physical limitations
- ★ Be medically able to participate in aggressive physical and vocational rehabilitation programs

- ★ Potential to benefit from a structured transition program in a residential living setting
- ★ Willing to dedicate 2-3 hours per day to supervised therapy and/or up to 4-6 hours per day to vocational therapy
- ★ Goals indicate a strong potential for rehabilitation and return to gainful employment
